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### **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

The City of Dorris City Council will hold a Public Hearing on Monday, March 1, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. in the City of Dorris Council Chambers, 307 S. Main Street, Dorris, California on the following item:

#### **MERGER ORDINANCE**

The project is a proposed amendment to Title 16, Subdivisions, of the Dorris Municipal Code that would establish a process for merging lots consistent with state law. As proposed, the amendment would add Chapter 16.06, Merger of Lots, to the Dorris Municipal Code.

It is anticipated that the code amendment will be determined to be exempt from environmental review pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) (i.e., the Commonsense Exemption). A CEQA exemption implies that the project will not result in any significant adverse environmental effects. The City Council will consider the appropriateness of said environmental recommendation based on the record of evidence before them. If substantial evidence has been presented demonstrating a more appropriate environmental determination than the one that has been recommended, the City Council may adopt an alternative environmental determination pursuant to the requirements of CEQA.

All publications are available for public review at the City of Dorris, 307 S. Main Street, Dorris, California, and all interested persons are invited to attend the meeting and be heard on any agenda item. In addition, a staff report for the project will be available at City Hall three working days prior to the City Council meeting. Please contact Carol McKay, City Administrator, at (530) 397-3511 on the day before the scheduled Public Hearing as to whether the item will be heard on that date or continued to another date.

All items presented to the City Council during a public hearing, including but not limited to, letters, e-mail, petitions, photos, or maps, become a permanent part of the record and must be submitted to the City Clerk. It is advised that the presenter bring 12 copies of anything presented to the Council and that the presenter create copies in advance for their own records.

If you challenge either the environmental determination or proposed project in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Dorris at, or prior to, the public hearing.
